## Key things to remember:

1. The Bible always has something to say to us, when I open it am I ready to listen?
2. Seek God and respond to what you find.
3. Before reading the Bible verses/passages, we must remember that the Bible wasn't written to us, but for us. It was written for a specific group, in a specific context, with specific needs or problems. We must ask - what was their: context / need / problems? After answering these, we can then read the verse/passage and ask ourselves how can we learn from this and apply the teaching/advice to ourselves?
4. It's more powerful and long lasting to ask the right questions to allow someone to discover the truth rather than just dictating the truth to them. #breadcrumbstothetruth #discipleship
