Top Tips:

1. Consistency

2. Creativity

3. Conversation

How can you create effective discussion? Good questioning! Ask open ended questions. Begin with things they can pick up from just looking at the passage. Develop your questions to be more reflective. Don't force your own opinions or ideas. Create a safe environment where everyone's opinion is valued.

Example Questions

Who, What, Where, When?

What does this tell me about God? What's the point?

What does this tell me about my life? How should I respond?
