Frequently Asked Questions

Soul Mates Weekend 2019

Dear Leader,

Thanks for thinking about coming to Soul Mates Weekend. We hope that you and your group enjoy the weekend and draw closer to God and each other as a result of it. Please find below some questions and answers that are commonly asked at Soul Mates time. If you have any that aren't answered, please feel free to get in contact with us at the address below.

What is Soul Mates Weekend?

Soul Mates Weekend is a worship and teaching event for 9-13 year olds run by **IMYC** (the Irish Methodist Youth & Children's Department.) Around 270 children and their leaders attend the weekend from all over Ireland congregate in Lurgan for a weekend of teaching, fun, worship and church-floor sleeping. We have a team of over 120 people who help put the weekend programme together.

Who can come to Soul Mates Weekend?

Anyone between the ages of 9 and 13 is allowed to come, provided that they are accompanied by a leader. Whilst Soul Mates is not solely for Christian or 'churched' children, the primary focus of the weekend is worship and teaching, so an explanation of what will happen would be a good thing for the children to hear, especially before the weekend. If you have a child who will turn 9 before the end of this school year, they are permitted to attend the weekend. **Children who turn 9 in the following school year will unfortunately not be permitted.**

What will happen?

The general pattern is thus:

Worship & Teaching on Friday night, Saturday morning & evening and Sunday morning;

Seminars after worship on Saturday morning (two of each) and **workshops** after lunch (two of each);

Entertainment on Friday night after worship (multiple venues) and our world-famous **Soul Stars** talent competition after worship on Saturday night.

Who runs Soul Mates Weekend?

Soul Mates Weekend is organised by **IMYC**, and we have a group of volunteers who spend the year putting the programme together. We have a proper band of musicians and worshippers who lead worship, a trained prayer team, an enthusiastic bunch of stewards and a team of professional sound, visual & lighting engineers.

When can I arrive?

Registration at Jethro centre opens at 18.30. Halls will also be open from 18:30 for leaving in baggage. Worship begins in Jethro at 19:30.

When does the weekend finish?

The weekend finishes with worship on Sunday morning. We'll be finishing before lunchtime at 11.30. This means that most groups will be home around lunchtime.

What do I do when I arrive?

Take your group to the hall that you have been assigned for accommodation, where stewards will direct you where to leave your bags. Send your main leader to the Jethro Centre for *Registration*. At *Registration*, you will receive your pack with:

weekend passes for each member of your group;

maps & timetables;

leader's guide;

group name sheets (for you to mark out your territory for sleeping);

confirmation of workshop & seminar choices.

What is Centrepoint?

Centrepoint is the nerve centre for Soul Mates Weekend. It is where *Registration* will take place on Friday night. If you have any questions over the weekend, come to Centrepoint, and Lost Property can be found there as well.

Where is Centrepoint?

When you come into the Jethro Centre, Centrepoint is immediately on your right. It will be open all weekend, except during worship on the Saturday evening.

How long will *Registration* last?

If you are fully paid up, with no changes to your group numbers, then *FastTrack Registration* is the queue for you. Otherwise join the other queue and hopefully you'll be done in a few minutes.

What if a child pulls out?

Please let IMYC know asap if you have children withdrawing from the weekend. Because of our limited numbers, we will be operating a waiting list operating on a 'one-in, one-out' basis. Unfortunately, we are unable to refund the full amount as we have to keep £10 as a deposit.

Can I bring extra children?

Once everything has been booked for the weekend, if you want to increase your numbers, contact IMYC and they will be added to our over-all waiting list. This will be operated on a 'one-in one-out' basis. Please don't bring extra children to the weekend as they may be turned away.

What Leaders can I bring?

The main group leader needs to be over 21, the other leaders need to be over 18. The ratios are one leader (gender specific) for each 8 children. Please ensure that you have enough leaders.

What about Child Protection/ Safeguarding?

Soul Mates Weekend employs the Safeguarding Policy 'Taking Care'. Please familiarise yourself with this document. If you require a copy, you can get one on imycd.org, from your minister or IMYC.

What do I do with their Parental Permission Forms?

Please bring two copies of the forms to the weekend. Please keep one copy for the main leader to have (at all times) and give one copy into Centrepoint at Registration.

What about Photo & Video Permission Forms?

If any of your parents have refused photo permission, please make us aware at Registration, and we will take appropriate steps. Please note we should be supplied with passport photos to aid us in this process.

Where will we be staying?

You will be staying in one of four halls:

High Street Methodist (HSM);

Queen Street Methodist (QSM);

Jethro Centre (JC);

High Street Presbyterian (HSP).

These will be allocated prior to the weekend. Please note that there will only be limited access to the halls during the day, so please plan accordingly.

What are the sleeping arrangements?

We ask that the leaders sleep separately from their children, whilst staying in the same room. This means that leaders can still supervise their children, but still observe Taking Care Guidelines.

Is there a curfew?

Yes, sadly for some, there is. We have lights off at midnight and everyone is expected to be asleep by 00.30. Group leaders are responsible for settling their children.

Who is in charge of Halls?

In each of the halls, there will be a team of volunteers to assist you however you are responsible for the safety discipline within your group. They will host a leaders' meeting at the earliest chance in the halls on Friday night after the evening program.

Things for Children to bring:

Sleeping bag, pillow, roll mat/ air bed (if desired);

pocket money;

sports gear (if participating in any of the sporting workshops);

wash bag & towel;

several changes of clothes;

Bible, notebook & pen.

What about food for the weekend?

All of your meals are already provided as part of the cost. The meals will be served as follows:

Breakfast: In your own halls (please help serve the children in your group);

Saturday Lunch: In Kings Park Primary School;

Saturday Tea: In your own halls

Friday & Saturday Supper: Jethro Centre

Soul Mates Weekend is a **Nut Free Zone**, so please ensure that none of your children or leaders bring or eat anything with nut products.

What do we do about Dietary Requirements?

It is most important that you include any dietary requirements on the application form to enable us to cater for your group.

Can I eat out?

We have ordered enough food for all of the participants and we do not want that food to go to waste. However, if you wish to treat your group with some fast food the best time would probably be after Soul Stars on Saturday night.

What if one of my children has special educational needs and/or a disability?

We are inclusive and will do all we can to help everyone have the best possible experience at Soul Mates Weekend. Please let us know about particular requirements at the booking stage and we will endeavour to put in place the procedures that we need.

What are the stewards for?

The stewards are paying volunteers at Soul Mates Weekend to ensure the smooth running of the event. They wear bright yellow t-shirts, if you have any questions, please ask them and be patient while they try to get you an answer. They are not there to discipline your group, so please ensure that you control your groups.

What do children need money for?

Free time on Saturday afternoon if you choose to let them go shopping in Lurgan.

What and where is the Prayer Team?

There may be some people who would like to take a bit of time to pray. With that in mind, we have a Prayer Team who have all been through prayer ministry training. They will be there over the course of the weekend wearing blue t-shirts.

How and where do I get first aid assistance?

At night:

Contact the key volunteer in your halls, who will contact the First Aider on duty.

During the day:

Come to Centrepoin and they will contact the First Aider on duty.

In an emergency:

Contact the emergency number (+44 7903 573015.)

What is the difference between Seminars & Workshops?

The seminars are the time when we go deeper into the overall theme of the weekend, and as such are spiritual in design. They are held in Kings Park Primary School which is a 5-minute walk from Jethro. The workshops are a chance to have some fun, take part in some physical or practical activities and let off a bit of steam. On Saturday afternoon, the Workshops are held in various churches around Lurgan. We will use High Street Methodist (HSM); Queen Street Methodist (QSM) and High Street Presbyterian (HSP).

Can I nip out for a coffee during the Seminars?

No, due to insurance guidelines, you need to be on the premises at all times. However, the staff room (with tea & coffee laid on!) is open if you want a break during session 1 only. You must go to the second session with your group.

How are the Seminars organised?

We split our seminars into two slots: for 9-11s and for 11-13s. Please exercise discernment when choosing which sessions each 11 year-old in your group attends.

How does our group book Seminars?

We release the titles of the seminars in time for your children to choose which seminars they want to go to. Ask your children to fill out their choices and return the form to [IMYC](#). Please be aware that spaces in these will be allocated on a first come, first served basis, so get in early to avoid disappointment. We try our best to accommodate but this may not always be possible. Once your

choices have been filtered into the system, you will be informed of the Seminars that your children have been allocated.

How does our group book Workshops?

You can book on **IMYC**'s website. You must rank all the workshops in order of preference. As workshops fill up, your group will be moved to the next available choice. We release the list of workshops in time for your children to choose which workshops they want to go to. Please be aware that spaces in many of these are limited, and therefore allocated on a first-come, first served basis. Book as early as you can to ensure your children get at least one of their choices. Once your choices have been filtered into the system, you will be informed of the Workshops that your children have been allocated.

What is Soul Stars?

Soul Stars is our talent show, which we hold on the Saturday evening. It is open to any child or group of children at Soul Mates wishing to enter (1 entry per group). The overall winner will walk away with the much-coveted Soul Stars trophy.

How can I book for Soul Stars?

You can either book through the website, or you can fill out the hard copy included in your booking pack and send it back to **IMYC** before the weekend, or give it to Rachel Bruce at Centrepoint by 10pm on Friday evening. (Rachel will be introduced from the stage).

Dear Parent / Guardian,

We hope that your child has a brilliant time at SOULMATES WEEKEND 2019! We thought it might be helpful to provide a list of things to bring and some additional information. There are some guidelines; an information sheet (which the group leader will fill out) and a 'to-bring' list for you to kit your children out!

1. Group leaders have full responsibility for your child at all times. Please ensure that you have completed and returned a permission slip, and health form to the group leader before the weekend. It is particularly important that you advise them of any allergies, or medical conditions which your child has.
2. Groups need to walk between venues for different activities. A warm coat (and/or waterproof), and a change of footwear are advisable.
3. Every year we end up with a lot of lost property, some of which is never claimed, even after we stand at the front of the church and wave it around! It is a good idea to mark your child's name inside their coat / other belongings.
4. We recommend that valuables, e.g. jewellery, mobile phones etc are left at home as we cannot take responsibility for any items lost, stolen or broken. Your child may wish to bring a small amount of pocket money to spend during their free time in Lurgan on Saturday afternoon.
5. Overnight accommodation is very basic (church hall floors) and washing facilities are limited.
6. **Please note: some people attending the weekend have nut allergies. Please make sure that your child does not bring any food, snacks or cosmetic products containing nuts or nut derivatives to the weekend, and remind them not to buy any foods containing nuts over the weekend.**

In a change from our usual format, seminars are going to be organised differently.

During session 1, all of our 9-11s will be going to the Assembly Hall to have a session with JMA.

Meanwhile the 11-13s will have a choice of three seminars.

During session 2, the 9-11s will have a choice of three seminars while our 11-13s will be going to the Assembly Hall to have a session with JMA.

- Seminars and workshops are first-come-first-served so book early to ensure that your group get their first choices.

The rules are:

- 1. No more than one entry per group.**
- 2. No longer than three minutes for each entry.**
- 3. The entries should fit one of the following categories:**
 - A song;
 - A dance (please bring a copy of the song to be used);
 - Playing a musical instrument;
 - Telling a joke;
 - Sketch/drama;
 - An imitation of someone famous;
 - A mime to their favourite song (please bring a copy of the song to be used)
4. Make sure the entries are age appropriate. We want to be responsible and to ensure that there are no mixed messages being promoted.
5. We therefore ask that all entries are screened by group leaders beforehand to ensure that they are not inappropriate for a children's church weekend.
SOULMATES WEEKEND reserves the right to refuse any group the opportunity to perform if we feel that the act is inappropriate.
6. Group entries are encouraged!
7. Return the form above as soon as possible. Entries may not be accepted after 10.00pm on Friday 1st March.
8. If your act is using media of any description (CDs etc), this needs to be clearly marked with the name of the owner, the group and the leader.

How to get to SOULMATES WEEKEND 2019

From Belfast Direction:

Take the M1 (South), travelling approximately 15 miles from Broadway Roundabout. Take A3 exit (Junction 9) signposted Moira/ Antrim. At Roundabout take 1st exit onto A3. Continue on this road (Lisburn Road/ Belfast Road) through Moira, Maralin and Dollingstown before entering Lurgan on the Avenue Road. When you reach the first major junction, turn left away from the town centre. 100 yards away on your left is the Jethro Centre. You are now in the correct place!

From Dungannon/ Enniskillen Direction:

At Strangmore Roundabout take 1st exit joining the M1 (signposted Belfast). Travel approximately 16 miles leaving M1 at Junction 10 (signposted Craigavon, Lurgan). At Roundabout take 3rd exit onto A76 (signposted Lurgan). Continue onto Lough Road, entering Lurgan Town Centre on Market Street, beside a big Church in middle of an island. Continue right through the town. At the second set of major traffic lights which is just past Fulton's Furniture Store make sure you are in the right-hand lane and veer right. Pass the petrol station on your left. The Jethro Centre is immediately on your left. You have arrived!

From Dublin/ Banbridge Direction:

Come off the A1 at Banbridge/ The Outlet exit. Go left at the initial Roundabout onto the A26 towards Banbridge. This road will take you straight into Banbridge. Follow the road through town. Once you cross over the river bridge, take the first left, which is Church Street. This will take you through Seapatrick and on towards Lurgan, once again becoming the A26. Follow the road past Lenaderg (with a right turn towards Waringstown & Lurgan.) Continue right through Waringstown towards Lurgan. When you arrive in Lurgan, at the first roundabout you meet, go right onto Flush Place. 100 yards away on your right is the Jethro Centre. You have completed your task. Well done.

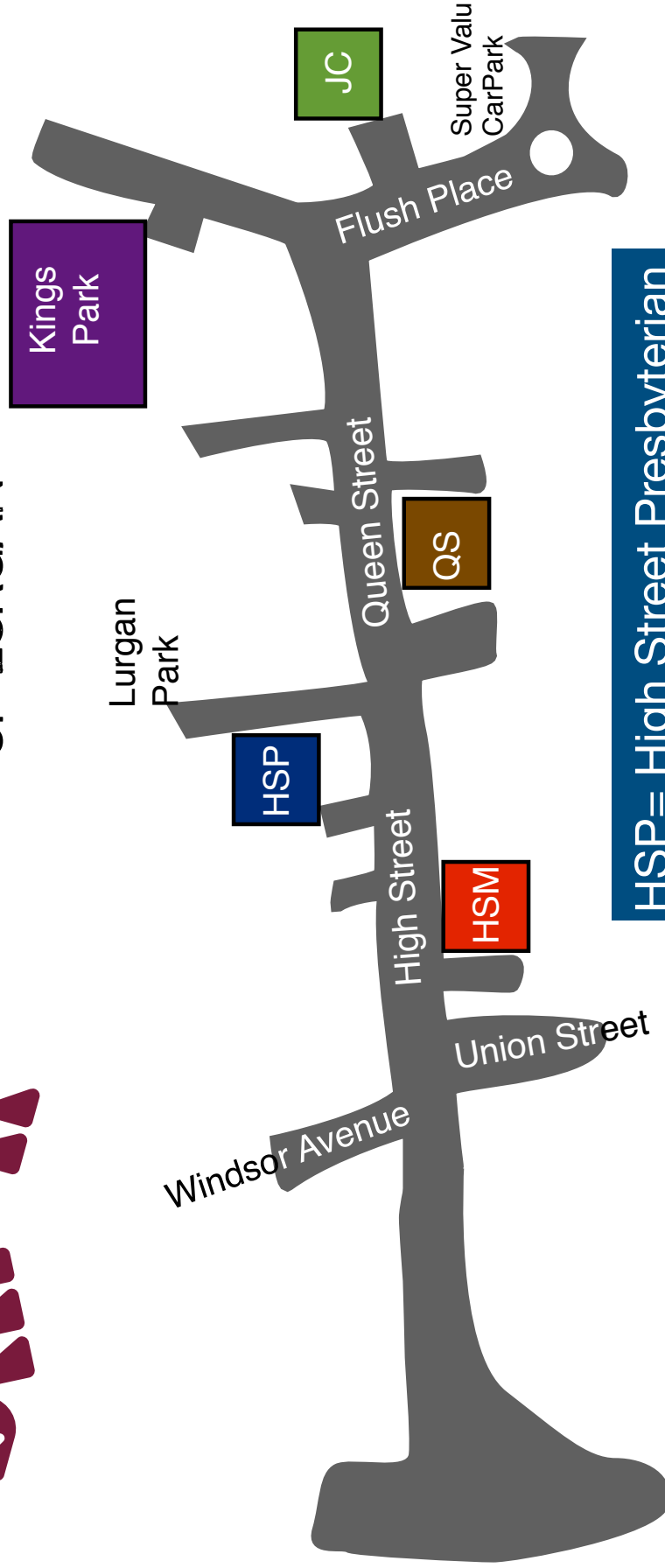
Please also observe the upper age limit. While some 14 year olds might want to come to Soul Mates, Autumn Soul is more appropriate for them.
